Article has a well-developed theoretical framework

Article has rigorous methodology

Article is well structured and well written

Once the peer-review process has been completed, authors are provided a feedback sheet that contains general feedback on their article. The Editorial Board will address the above criteria and provide authors with a decision on their article. These decisions are outlined in the peer-review process infographic, available on the AONTAS website.

The Editorial Board and Editorial Office will provide authors with recommendations and suggestions on how they can make their article stronger. Additionally, authors receive a tracked changed document that contains specific feedback on their article.
